The de Blasio administration announced today that Department of Cultural Affairs Commissioner Tom Finkelpearl will take a leave of absence from the agency to treat a recently arisen health issue. Until he returns, DCLA Deputy Commissioner Edwin Torres will serve as Acting Commissioner.

Statement from Mayor Bill de Blasio:

"Tom Finkelpearl has helped bring the arts to New Yorkers across the five boroughs as Commissioner of the Department of Cultural Affairs, showing this City exactly what it means when we say 'arts and culture are for everyone.' Tom has been a strong and innovative leader, with a clear vision of how we can more equitably support and celebrate the arts throughout our city. From launching the diversity initiative to create a more inclusive and vibrant cultural community, to playing an instrumental role in providing free cultural memberships to all IDNYC card holders, Tom understands how the arts can help inspire and enrich all our lives. My thoughts are with him and his family as he takes time to focus on his health, and we look forward to welcoming him back after this period of recovery."

"It is a tremendous honor to serve as New York's Cultural Affairs Commissioner under Mayor de Blasio, and I'm grateful for the opportunity to help lead this extraordinary department.
