Make sure to vote! In person <u>early voting</u> is now open through November 1st, or you can vote on Election Day, November 3rd. You can still mail your absentee ballot (with proper postage paid!) so it is postmarked by November 3rd. <u>Find both your early voting and election day poll sites here</u>

FEDERAL

- 1. <u>Heroes Small Business Lifeline Act</u> introduced. Part of this bill is the expanded PPP eligibility for all nonprofits, regardless of size and type, as well as a second round of PPP, a new grant program to provide up to \$50,000 grants to very small nonprofits, and other critical assistance. Refer to <u>summary</u>.
- 2. Dance/USA Updates:
- a. Use Dance/USA's <u>advocacy action alert</u> to contact your Congressional delegation to urge immediate action to provide pandemic relief for the arts sector, including the dance community.

NEW YORK STATE

- 1. Gov. Andrew Cuomo excluded neighboring New Jersey, Connecticut and Pennsylvania from New York's quarantine list despite a spike in COVID-19 cases, stating there was "no practical way" to enforce such a limitation, <u>The New York Times reports.</u> He stressed that <u>non-essential travel</u> between the states should be avoided.
- Eight additional companies have received support from the State to help produce PPE. Empire State Development, New York's economic development agency, <u>awarded \$4.9 million</u> to eight NY-based companies to help alleviate product shortages.

NEW YORK CITY

- 2. After Cuomo previewed the State's vaccine distribution protocols, NYC Mayor Bill de Blasio announced the city's own version of plans for distributing a COVID-19 vaccine, once one arrives. In the city's two-phase distribution plan, a limited number of doses will be provided to health care personnel, front-line workers and other vulnerable populations. A second phase will reach more of the general population, and could come in 2021.
- 3. COVID-19 Updates:
- a. U.S. Sets Coronavirus Case Record Amid New Surge, <u>The New York Times reports.</u>
- b. The positivity rate in the "micro-cluster" focus areas was 3.25%. The statewide positivity rate excluding these areas was 1.18%. To find out where the "micro-cluster" zones are, and to see what restrictions apply to each zone, please visit www.nyc.gov/covidzone.
 - c. Download the $\underline{\text{COVID Alert NY app}}$ today!
- d. Remember to follow the "core four"—wear a mask, wash your hands, practice social distancing, stay home if you're sick—and get tested! For more information on free testing, personal protective equipment and more, please visit the <a href="https://www.ncb.nummer.
- 4. Open Healthcare enrollment runs from November 1 through December 15 Learn more at <u>Healthcare.gov</u> and also at <u>The Actor's Fund</u>.
- 5. Sign up for free Flu Shots with the Actors Fund.
- 6. De Blasio restores about half of the funding his administration has cut from its housing department budget, in an attempt to lessen the blow of COVID-19 to his affordable housing plans, the <u>Gothamist reports</u>.
- 7. New York City is launching a new program to address the mental health impact of the pandemic on young people living in the neighborhoods hit hardest by COVID-19. <u>AM New York reports</u> that the initiative will have current NYC mental health counselors deployed to lead group therapy sessions at 350 schools across the city, and will educate students as well as their caregivers.
