The Tap City Youth Ensemble is a project of the American Tap Dance Foundation. The ensemble features dancers ages 12-19, from throughout the metropolitan NYC and surrounding areas or Long Island, Connecticut, upstate New York and New Jersey.

The Ensemble rehearses weekly on Sundays with Ensemble Director and choreographer Susan Hebach and TCYE faculty Claudia Rahardjanoto and Tamii Sakurai, and works with selected guest teachers and choreographers including Chloe Arnold, Brenda Bufalino, Barbara Duffy, Michelle Dorrance, Derick K. Grant, Lisa LaTouche, Michela Marino-Lerman, Max Pollak, Randy Skinner, Tony Waag and Margaret Morrison. The ensemble has new contemporary works as well as classic tap repertory by Bill "Bojangles" Robinson, James "Buster" Brown, Eddie Brown, Charles "Honi" Coles and the Copasetics. The Ensemble has been featured in articles in Dance Teacher Magazine, Dance Spirit Magazine and Time Out New York Kids and appeared on television on NY 1. and Nickelodeon's METV.

TCYE performs in a variety of New York area, from informal showings, promotional events, school shows, hospitals, outdoor concerts and professional performance venues. Performance highlights include: Rhythm in Motion, Celebrating Gregory-ATDF Gala, Symphony Space, Tap City, the New York Tap Festival, the Vancouver Tap Festival, Jazz at Lincoln Center in collaboration with MSJA, Macy's Thanksgiving Day Parade 2010, Amateur Night at the Apollo, Career Transitions for Dancers Gala at NYC's City Center, Lincoln Center Library for Performing Arts, and more!
