The vision and artistry of legendary dancer Vaslav Nijinsky were revolutionary. While widely regarded as a ballet choreographer, Nijinsky introduced a movement vocabulary that diverged from the classical ballet language; in his search for an expressive physicality, Nijinsky might be thought of among such pioneers of modern dance as Loie Fuller and Isadora Duncan. In this course, we will retrace the groundbreaking journeys of Fuller, Duncan, and Nijinsky as we explore the rich dance culture of the two decades prior to World War I. The course will feature guest speakers, rare film footage, and the careful analysis of performances, bringing to life a golden era of invention in dance.
