8) Actions to Save the NEA, NEH, IMLS, and CPB

The Trump Administration's budget proposal eliminates funding for the National Endowment for the Arts (NEA), the National Endowment for the Humanities (NEH), the Institute of Museum and Library Services (IMLS), and the Corporation for Public Broadcasting (CPB). The combined

\$971 million budget for these four agencies represents only 0.02% of the federal budget.
