Dear Dance Community,

We write to you today with profound sorrow to acknowledge the tragic murder of dancer O'Shae Sibleyfollowing an attack outside of a Brooklyn gas station on Saturday night. He was a beloved member of the Vogue and Ballroom community in NYC, a devoted and cherished student of the Ailey Extension program, and a former apprentice of Philadanco!'s D/2 company. As we mourn O'Shae, we invite you to join us for a moment of solidarity and collective action.

The violence endured by our LGBTQIA+ community-disproportionately affecting Black, Indigenous, and peoples of color-starkly underscores the work that lies ahead to dismantle the homophobia and transphobia sown by white supremacy. The surge of anti-LGBTQIA+ legislation, politicians, and media promoting anti-gay rhetoric has emboldened said violence and has led to the loss of O'Shae's precious and meaningful life.

As we continue our collective journey toward justice and equity, we must recognize that true liberation remains an aspiration yet to be fully realized. We remain firmly in support of the well-being and safety of our LGBTQIA+, Black, Indigenous, and peoples of color dance colleagues, and we continue to champion the role that dance can play to foster inclusion, integration, healing, and human rights in the New York City
