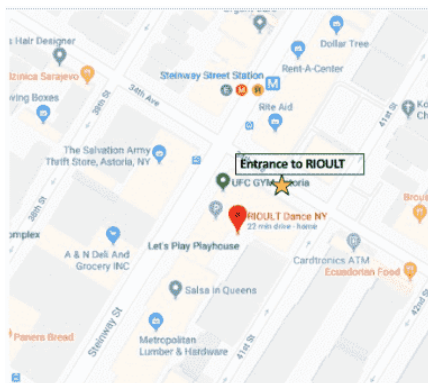
Accessibility Features:



RIOULT Dance Center is an accessible venue. The entrance is located on 34th Avenue (between Steinway and 41st Street). The building door requires a buzzer to enter. The buzzer is located on the left hand side of the building door. An elevator is available via the main entrance on 34th Ave (between Steinway and 41st Street). You may take the elevator to the second floor where all studio spaces and registration are located. All interior spaces and rooms are wheelchair accessible. All restrooms are gender inclusive and wheelchair accessible. Studios and communal spaces are lit by a combination of fluorescent lights and incandescent lights. ASL interpretation will be provided. Dance/NYC will not be able to provide child care or health care for this event.
