WHITE WAVE Dance Brief Overview:

Formed in 1988, WHITE WAVE Dance is a non-profit arts organization whose main goal is to be a catalyst for change in the NY dance scene. From its full-length dance productions to dance education and outreach, WHITE WAVE accomplishes its mission by providing opportunities for dancers and choreographers to create, rehearse, perform and network with each other, engaging in an ongoing dialogue that pushes the art form forward.

After 14 successful years of operation in DUMBO, WHITE WAVE recently relocated its administrative operations to Bedford-Stuyvesant (J train, Kosciuszko Street), and is looking to transition into a new, permanent home in the second half of the year.

Activities:

Interns/Volunteers will have a unique opportunity to assist in various aspects of the pre-production of WHITE WAVE's upcoming 2016 festival season, which includes:

- 10th Annual Wave Rising Series (June 13th 26th, 2016 at 92Y Harkenss Dance Center)
- First ever SoloDuo Festival (May 21st & 22nd, 2016 at Poet's Den Theater)
- 16th Annual DUMBO Dance Festival (September 29th October 2nd, 2016 at Gelsey Kirkland ArtsCenter)

Their tasks will include, but are not limited to

- * The development and distribution of application materials/Calls for Proposals
- * Assisting in marketing and PR activities such as social media outreach and online marketing
- * Assisting in Grant research and grant writing
- * Data entry, web-based research, and other general office activities

Internships are unpaid, but can be used for academic credit. Interns should expect to work 10-20 hours per week. The work schedule for interns is flexible within our office hours, Mon-Fri, 10am-6pm.
