In June of 2016, there was a tragic shooting at the Pulse nightclub in Orlando, Florida. This hate crime caused a lot of shock across the nation and facilitated a lot of conversations involving gun control and the hate the LGBTQ community continues to face. In response, Awaken Dance Theater organized a tribute concert give local artists a place to express the grief and anger they felt, stand in solidarity with the LGBT community, and begin to heal. This event, which was called the Tribute to Orlando from the NYC Dance Community, was free and open to the public and helped 16 dance companies from all over New York City come together in under a week.
