Applications are now open for the 2020-2021 Season of the BRIClab Performance Residency from BRIC in Brooklyn.

BRIClab supports performers, visual artists, and media makers in the development of new work. There are multiple types of BRIClab Residency Programs available at BRIC. Visual art and media residences each have their own timelines and applications. The BRIClab Performance Residency is a commissioning and residency development program for New York City-based performing artists to explore and expand the possibilities of their work in music, dance, theater, and multidisciplinary performance. Free and open exploration and intentional commitment to process—with the support of the staff and resources that BRIC offers—are at the heart of the BRIClab Performance Residency program. Artists receive stipends and an intensive residency in BRIC's Artist Studio with development time, opportunities for artistic mentoring, and work-in-process performances.

Applications are now being accepted for the 2020-2021 BRIClab Performance Residency Season, which runs from September 2020 through April 2021.

DEADLINE TO APPLY: Thursday, January 30, 2020

Artists receive:

- Exclusive use of the BRIC House Artist Studio for 10-12 days (10AM 10PM)
- Artist stipend of \$1750
- Artistic mentoring
- Technical support from BRIC's production staff
- Two work-in-process showings (dates/times determined by BRIC)
- Documentation of showings

SELECTION CRITERIA

BRIClab is for Brooklyn or New York City based artists who:

- Are developing new work in the performing arts that is relevant to diverse Brooklyn audiences.

- Are exploring their interests and questions with thoughtful processes and can articulate a context for their work.

- Are excited by the opportunity to share their work with the public and who embrace dialogue with audiences as a meaningful part of their process.

- Have a performing arts piece that is in the middle of its development (projects that require only actors at a table, or projects that are looking

for tech time before a premiere are not the best fit for a BRIClab Performance Residency).

- Can articulate (for multi-disciplinary work) an understanding or purposeful examination of how the various disciplines will interact and serve the whole.

- Are at least 18 years of age and not currently in an undergraduate degree program.
- Have not been granted a BRIClab Performance Residency before.

Across the season of BRIClab Performance Residencies we look for diversity and/or resonance in:

- racial and cultural perspective
- discipline (dance, theater, music, multi-discipline)
- method/practice (collaboratively developed, solo work, heavily researched, more or less embodied, etc.)
- place in career (emerging, mid-career, and established)

Projects will be chosen through an internal curatorial review that includes BRIC staff and former BRIClab Performance Resident Artists.

Recent projects developed with BRIClab Performance Residency support have gone on to have presentations at venues including: BAM, NYTW, The Invisible Dog, Abrons Art Center, The Kitchen, REDCAT (LA), Portland Institute of Contemporary Art's TBA Festival, Theater Alliance, FABNYC, New York Live Arts, the Metropolitan Museum of Art and Performance Space New York.

2. Applications require a project description, project history, artist bio(s), and work samples.

3. Applicants will be required to cover online application fees. A completed submission including work samples is \$5.
