Movers & Shapers: A Dance Podcast is an interview podcast with the goal to provide the dance community and beyond an opportunity to hear from its contributing artists through personalized interviews. Hosted by Artistic Director of The Moving Architects Erin Carlisle Norton, Movers & Shapers promises intriguing dialogue, circulating and documenting the research and creative endeavors surrounding impactful minds of the dance field. Discussions span from early encounters with dance to future hopes and plans, thereby revealing artist's lesser-known stories along the way to finding personal success. Serving as a library of collective dance knowledge since it began in June 2015, the podcast currently has over 100 episodes of interviews and growing that are free and available to download at any time, with new episodes every other week. The types of artists one can expect to hear from include choreographers, performers, scholars, educators, artistic collaborators, media artists, and other administrative figures and leaders from the field.
