Full Job Description

We are seeking a social justice-focused, dedicated, and enthusiastic teaching artist who specializes in teaching West African dance and drumming, Caribbean, or other Afro styles for kids and adults. We are seeking teaching artists who are highly trained and immersed in their styles, who value both strong technique, play, and positive classroom management. The perfect candidate will have experience working with children aged 4-adult. This position has plenty of opportunities for growth as the instructor will have their own classes to conduct at Dance Project of WH with a possibility of additional outreach classes and events.

We are committed to inclusion, and require teachers who embrace the opportunity to include students of all learning styles and needs. Participation in periodic faculty meetings and various training is required. We are seeking a commitment starting this September and continuing through at least the end of the academic year (June 2026), preferably longer.

All faculty and staff will receive training on trauma-informed teaching practices, anti-racism training, LGBTQ sensitivity training, and ongoing opportunities for other professional development.

Ability to communicate to diverse audiences and communities through movement and dance
