Experience the Pilobolus creative process during a five-day movement intensive at our home in Washington, CT. In these playful, group-driven, physical and fun workshops, Pilobolus teaching artists share the method that has guided the company for 40+ years. These workshops are great for dancers as well as those with absolutely no dance experience. Participants will have time for dedicated play, to develop new tools to access creativity, improve one's ability to work effectively in groups, and think more efficiently on one's feet. Each class will also attend one Pilobolus performance at The Joyce Theater in NYC, followed by a meet-and-greet with the dancers.

Week 3: Vision & Revision

Taught by an Associate Artistic Director, this week will dig deep into the choreographic process and not just create, but polish, edit and revise. **Previous Pilobolus Workshop participation required.*
