Dear New York City Dance Community,

As the leading advocate for dance, Dance/NYC is working to help the City help you during a challenging budgeting process, with significant cuts from the State and a reduction in federal aid.

The proposed FY 2012 for the Department of Cultural Affairs (DCA) is just over \$100 million, which represents a cut of approximately \$50 million (over 30 percent).

The New York City Council's public hearing for the full FY 2012 budget is:
