FEDERAL UPDATES

- On June 18, 2020, the <u>Supreme Court ruled against</u> Trump's attempt to end DACA, a win for undocumented 'Dreamers' brought to U.S. as children
- PPP Forgiveness Applications Following the passage of H.R. 7010 The Paycheck Protection Flexibility Act of 2020 June 5, 2020, SBA and Treasury announced revised application forms for loan forgiveness on June 16. In addition to updating the original Full Forgiveness Application, SBA also published a new EZ Forgiveness Application version of the forgiveness application that applies to borrowers that: did not reduce the salaries or wages of their employees by more than 25% and did not reduce the number of hours of their employees, OR experienced reductions in business activity as a result of health directives related to COVID-19, and did not reduce the salaries or wages of their employees by more than 25%.
- The Federal Reserve Main Street Lending Program is available to nonprofits now. There are two types thenew loan facility and the expanded loan facility. Loans would be available to charitable nonprofits with between 50 and 15,000 employees, have operated for at least 5 years, donations made up less than 30% of total 2019 revenues, and endowments do not exceed \$3 billion. Eligible nonprofits could take out non-forgivable loans ranging from \$250,000 to \$300 million at an interest rate of less than 4%. Public Comments may be submitted until Monday, June 22.
- Advocate to get <u>H.R. 40</u>: <u>Commission to Study and Develop Reparation Proposals for African-Americans Act</u> passed. The bill was introduced to the House in January 2019 and needs to be considered by the committee before it can be sent on to the House or Senate as a whole.

STATE UPDATES

- <u>Juneteenth Executive Order</u> Governor Cuomo issued an Executive Order recognizing Juneteenth as a holiday for state employees, in recognition of the official emancipation of African Americans throughout the United States.
- Emergency Rent Relief Act Signed On June 17 Governor Cuomo signed <u>A10552/S8419</u>, the *Emergency Rent Relief Act*, which sets aside \$100 million for rental assistance for rent-burdened tenants.
- State Marketplace Open Enrollment New York is extending the <u>open enrollment</u> period to get health insurance through the state marketplace to July 15.
