Weekly Advocacy Alert, September 30: Register to Vote by October 9th!

Register to Vote by October 9th:

- a. The NYC Board of Elections (BOE) recently launched two new online portals for absentee voting ahead of the November 3 General Election on its <u>Vote NYC website</u>: one that allows residents to <u>apply online for a mail-in ballot</u> and another that allows applicants to <u>track their ballot</u> online.
 - b. If you aren't registered to vote, or need to change your voter registration address, visit https://elections.ny.gov for more info.

FEDERAL

- 1. Updates on Federal:
- a. <u>U.S. Department of Labor</u> today announced a proposed rule clarifying the definition of employee under the Fair Labor Standards Act (FLSA) as it relates to independent contractors.
 - i. The National Employment Law Project response statement
 - b. Stopgap spending bill
- i. The House approved a stopgap spending bill to avert a government shutdown next week that includes tens of billions of dollars in relief for farmers and for nutritional assistance, the <u>Times reports</u>.
 - c. Dance/USA Updates
- i. Use Dance/USA's advocacy action alert to contact your Congressional delegation to urge immediate action to provide pandemic relief for the arts sector, including the dance community.

NEW YORK STATE

- 1. Travel Advisories:
- a. Individuals traveling to New York from Colorado, Minnesota, Nevada, Rhode Island and Wyoming must quarantine for 14 days upon arriving in New York. Arizona and Virginia have been removed. See more info here.
 - b. International travelers from Level 2 and Level 3 countries must complete a 14 day quarantine. Learn more here.
- 2. Governor Cuomo extended the residential <u>eviction moratorium</u> to January 1, 2021
- 3. Contact State Legislators
- a. <u>Fund Excluded Workers</u> contact legislators, sign petition, organization sign to tax billionaires to create emergency income, including retroactive payments, for all excluded New Yorkers.

NEW YORK CITY

- 1. Census extended to October 5th!:
 - a. Take the census and get your friends and family to complete the census!
 - $b. \ Each \ New \ Yorker \ represents \ \$3,000 \ in \ federal \ funding \ each \ year. \ Our \ city's \ share \ of \ \$675 \ billion \ in \ federal \ dollars \ each \ year \ is \ at \ stake.$
- c. If we are undercounted, we will lose seats in Congress, which means a weaker voice in Washington on decisions that affect our future on local and state levels.

- 2. COVID-19 cases growing at alarming rate in neighborhoods around City:
 - a. More than 1,000 New Yorkers test positive for COVID-19, which has not happened since June.
- b. These 9 zip codes are COVID-19 hotspots and reopening will be scaled back and possible shutdowns in these zip codes. These zip codes account for 26% of new cases but only represent 7% of the City's population.
 - i. 11223, 11230, 11415, 11691, 11219, 11204, 11229, 11210, 11367
 - c. These zip codes show increased growth above city average and are being monitored as potential hotspots

i. 11374, 11218, 11235, 11211, 11249

- d. If you are experiencing COVID symptoms or believe you were exposed to someone who tested positive for COVID, get tested. Find a testing site near you.
