- West 62nd Street
- The David Geffen Hall and David H. Koch Theater entrance ramps on the corner of West 63rd and 65th Streets and Columbus Avenue.

About: Dance/NYC is pleased to join with Buglisi Dance Theatre, and its partners the Lincoln Center and Nel Shelby Productions to present the [Reimagined Table of Silence Project 9/11](#). This free, public performance ritual for global unity and peace was conceived and choreographed by Jacquelyn Buglisi, 2020 Bessie Award Special Citation Honoree, and features live and virtual elements. Reimagined for our current time, and in honor of the 20th anniversary of 9/11, this year's *Table of Silence Project* honors the lives lost on 9/11 and the years since, and the current crises that face humanity today.

Performance Details: The live performance features an excerpt of Buglisi's masterwork *Requiem*, created in 2001 as an immediate response to 9/11, and the reimagined *Table of Silence Prologue* ritual, created in 2020 at the height of the pandemic. These works are performed live by 36 dancers encircling Lincoln Center's Revson Fountain, with Daniel Bernard Roumain on violin, Marc Bamuthi Joseph performing his spoken word piece *Awakening*, and Terese Capucilli leading the ritual as Bell Master. The livestream also includes the World Premiere of

Études II, a film by Nel Shelby Productions that features dancers from around the world in movement stories inspired by the twelve repetitive sacred gestures of the *Table of Silence Project*; and the full presentation of the 2019 *Table of Silence Project 9/11*, a public tribute to the events of 9/11 and a call to action for peace in our world. The program concludes at 8:46 a.m. when together we raise our arms in a moment of silence for peace.
